A close contact is a person who has had face to face contact with a COVID-19 case and there is reasonable risk of transmission. This may include household contacts, extensive social interaction with a case or being present at a high risk setting.



A casual contact is a person who has been in the same location as a COVID-19 case during their infectious period, but did not have face to face contact.



A low risk exposure is someone who has been in the same setting with a COVID-19 case in their infectious period, but has had minimal contact.
