PEAL - Plain English Allergen Labelling

The updated Plain English Allergen Labelling regulations for food offered for sale in Australia came into effect 25th February 2021, with a 3-year transition period. In summary, the regulations require all Allergens to be listed in their **required names as:

- **Bold text** within a statement of ingredients (when a product is required to bear a label), and;
- In a separate bold type "Contains" statement in the same field of view as the statement of ingredients; and directly next to the statement of ingredients; and be distinctly separated from the statement of ingredients.

All Stores who pack and label food products in-store for sale in Self-Serve Displays or Assisted Serviced Displays should review their labels/product information, update this information in their BOS to the new legislative requirements and ensure **bold text type** is able to be printed from Scales and Labelling Machines **by no later than 25th February 2024.**
