### Corporal Cameron Baird VC MG



Stewart Baird VC MG was born in Burnie, Tasmania, on 7 June 1981.

This distinguished soldier was a member of 2nd Commando Regiment and had previously been awarded the Medal for Gallantry in 2007. In February 2014, Baird was awarded the Victoria Cross for Australia posthumously for his actions in Uruzgan province, Afghanistan, on 22 June 2013.

Together with Ben Roberts-Smith, Baird is one of only two soldiers to be awarded both the Victoria Cross for Australia and Medal for Gallantry.

Cpl Baird's personal motto was "Aspire to Inspire". The Tasmanian Government awards a scholarship in Corporal Baird's name each year.

Evandale, won the Victoria Cross during action that lasted for nearly 48 hours at Gueudecourt, France.

Murray led a force of 140 men in an assault on a position known as Stormy Trench. During the battle he distinguished himself by encouraging his men, setting an example, leading hand-grenade bombing parties, leading bayonet charges, rescuing the wounded and carrying them to safety, crawling out in no-man's-land on reconnaissance, rallying his men and saving the situation by sheer valour. They were forced to withdraw due to the overwhelming enemy firepower, and only 48 of the 140 survived.

Together with the Evandale History Society, on 29 March 2017, I hosted the  $100^{TH}$  anniversary of Harry Murray VC award. With special guests, Doug Baird (father of Corporal Cameron Baird VC MG), and Harry's great niece Anne Batalibasi we paid tribute to this brave soldier.

# FIGHT ON! THE CAMPAIGN FOR TEDDY SHEEAN CONTINUES

The fight to have the extraordinary bravery of Ordinary Seaman Edward 'Teddy' Sheean continues.

Spearheaded by Teddy's nephew Garry Ivory and myself, the campaign has gone all the way to Buckingham Palace, London.

In February 2017 a submission was sent to the British Admiralty seeking re-

consideration for an award for bravery in having Teddy's courage recognised with a Victoria Cross.

Sheean, from Latrobe joined the Royal Australian Navy and served on the HMAS Armidale where in 1942, under a hail of enemy aircraft fire, Sheean strapped himself into an Oerlikon gun position and continued firing as his ship disappeared beneath the waves.



He shot down one plane and damaged another, with crewmates seeing tracer bullets rising from beneath the surface as Sheean was dragged under the water, firing until the end.

He died on I December 1942 aged just 18, leaving an example of courage that still lives today.
